2014 was the third year of our capital road project. The section of Main Street from the Meadow Brook Bridge to the Roxbury-Byron town line was rebuild and paved. Several stream crossings were reconstructed and the culverts were sized in an attempt to prevent washouts in the future. During the year we completed the rebuild and paving all of the streets in the village. A new loop road was constructed in the Pine View Cemetery which will improve vehicle access. At the Town Office we relocated the entrance and removed the existing material and replaced it with compacted crushed gravel. With your approval, we plan to have the parking lot paved in 2015.

During 2014 volunteers conducted a watershed survey of Roxbury Pond. The results are being compiled this winter with report being released this summer. The health of the Pond continues to be of concern. The survey is an attempt to identify and fix items which are causing problems.

We are asking the town for funds to develop plans and permits for installing dry hydrants at various locations in order to improve fire protection throughout the town. In addition we would like to have engineering plans developed for replacing the Meadow Brook Bridge and constructing a new sand salt shed.

Again. I would like to thank my fellow selectmen, Mike Worthley and Tim Derouche, for all of the work they have done throughout the year. In addition, the Board would like to recognize the dedicated staff at the Town Office. The work that Renee and Nina do, allows the Board to be successful conducting Town Affairs.

#### Northern Oxford Regional Solid Waste Board

#### Annual Report 2014

In 2014, revenues from recycling decreased by \$9,150 due to drops in the markets for materials. However, the revenues received did cover the costs of the recycling operations. We were also able to do a number of improvements at the transfer station/recycling center including paving the facility.

In 2014 we processed a total of 9633 tons of municipal solid waste from our six member towns compared to 9080 in 2013. The cost in 2014 for disposal (not including transportation) was \$486,305. We recycled 938 tons of materials in 2014, bringing in total revenues of \$102,641. This amount is down from the 965 ton figure in 2013.

Separating recyclables from your trash not only creates revenue, but decreases the cost of disposal. Most of the trash created by an average person is made up of 50% recyclables, yet only 10% is currently being recycled.

Materials that are recyclable include aluminum and metal cans, newspaper, office paper, magazines, junk mail and any cardboard including paperboard such as cereal boxes, eggs cartons, shoe boxes, etc. Plastic recycling has been expanded to include all plastic containers with the exception of plastic bags and Styrofoam. Glass in currently being landfilled on site and includes glass containers, drinking glasses and cups, plates and baking dishes, etc.

We collected 91 units of household hazardous waste from area residents during the June 2014 collection.

Remember, universal waste such as fluorescent lamps, thermometers, mercury switches, TVs, computer monitors and towers, etc. must also be separated from the waste stream. These items should be brought to the Recycling and Transfer Station on Route 2 in Mexico.

## Report of The General Assistance Administrator

The Selectpersons adopted the General Assistance Ordinance prepared by Maine Municipal Association, in 1997. The Appendices (A-C) are revised each year by Maine Municipal Association, which increases the amounts allowed. The Ordinance helps those in need and directs them to be responsible by living within their means. Applicants must show that they are attempting to improve their present situation which has caused them to seek assistance.

**2014:** We received 3 applications for assistance and paid 3 applicants which consisted of 3 Individuals, with one being a repeat. Of those 3 cases, we paid \$851.00 for heat, \$339.16 for electricity, \$191.84 for Food. The Total cost for the 3 cases was \$1,382.00.

**2014:** \$1,832.87 was carried over from 2013, with an additional \$500.00 appropriated for a total of \$2,332.87 in 2014 budget.

**2014:** \$1,382.00 was spent, with \$521.42 reimbursed by the State of Maine. That leaves a balance of \$1,472.29 in the account to be carried over into the 2015 budget.

With a slower than normal economy, we received same application's as 2013;

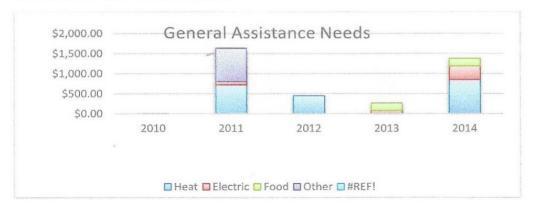

Phase 1. (July, 2012 to September, 2012 – Complete)

Completed Reconstruction of Main Street and start of South Shore road to the bridge (3,870 feet). All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Ditched sides, Dug up sections of road at times up to 36" and re-graveled, Ground remainder of road and install 2" base pavement. (Note: 1" Surface Pavement completed in 2014)

#### Phase 2. (Duration - September, 2012 to November, 2013 - Complete)

Reconstruction of Swain Farm Road (2,871 feet) All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Ditched both sides, Removed 12 large Pine Trees, Dug up 1,550' section of bad condition road and re-graveled, Grind remainder of road and installed 2" of Base pavement and shoulder work rebuild.

Reconstruction of end of Horseshoe Valley Road, Consisting from Swain Farm Road intersection to the end of Horseshoe Valley Road (5,280 feet) All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Ditched sides and Tree's removal completed. Dig up two sections of bad condition road and re-graveled, Grind remainder of road and install 2" of Base pavement and shoulder work rebuild.

Reconstruction of Old County Road (1,257 feet) All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Tree removal completed, Ditched both sides, Dig up old pavement and re-graveled where needed completed, Installed 2" Base Pavement and complete shoulder work rebuild.

#### Phase 3: (Duration - April, 2013 to November, 2013- Complete)

Reconstruction of beginning of Horseshoe Valley Road, Consisting from Intersection of Roxbury Notch Road and Horseshoe Valley Road to the intersection to the Swain Farm Road & Horseshoe Valley Road (7,627 feet) All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Ditched both sides. Dug up one section of bad condition road and re-graveled, Blasted Rocks, Grind remainder of road and installed 2" of Base pavement and shoulder work rebuild.

Reconstruction of Medawisla Way (1,340 feet) All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic. Tree removal completed, Ditching west side completed,

Dug up two sections of bad condition road and re-graveled, Grind Old pavement and Install 2" of Base Pavement and complete shoulder work rebuild.

**Phase 4.** (Duration – April, 2014 to November, 2014 – Complete)

Village Roads (2,610 feet) – Reconstruction of All Village Roads. All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic., Replaced All Curbs, Tree Trimming, Grind all roads with 2" Base Paving & 1" Surface Paving along with complete shoulder work rebuild.

Remainder of Main Street (9,149 feet) Reconstruction of road, All Major Lake supply Culverts having been engineered to fish passage specs, All Culverts resized to current standard sizing with extended life plastic., Grind all, Pave 5,149' with 2" base pavement with 1" Surface pavement the remainder 4,000' has 2" base pavement only and complete shoulder work. Two off street angled parking areas were installed.

Town Hall Parking Area was fully excavated and proper drainage material installed along with driveway entrance moved for Fire Truck Ease. (Town Hall Parking Pavement expected in 2015)
